1.	Bangor University	None.	-
2.	Birmingham City University	None.	-
3.	University College Birmingham	£750 per year each year.	Bursary is awarded if family income is less than £30.000 per year.
4.	University of Bradford	£500 per year each year.	Bursary is awarded if family income is less than £38.000 per year.
5.	Canterbury Christ Church University	£900 per year each year OR £560 per year each year	£900 is awarded if family income is less than £25.000 per year. £560 is awarded if family income is between £25.000 and £50.020 per year.
6.	University of Central Lancashire	£338 per year each year.	Bursary is awarded if family income is less than £25.000 per year.
7.	Coventry University	£1000 per year each year.	Academic Scholarship is awarded to the 280 (EU and UK) students who achieve the highest grades at Baccalaureat stage. The minimum grade needed is 9.50 but only the first 280 students will get the bursary.
8.	University of Derby	£1234 per year each year.	Bursary is awarded if family income is less than £13.000 per year.
9.	University of Greenwich	None.	-
10.	University of Essex	None.	-
11.	University of Glamorgan	None.	-
12.	University of Huddersfield	£500 per year each year.	Bursary is awarded if family income is less than £25.000 per year.
13.	London Metropolitan University	None.	-
14.	Middlesex University	None.	-
15.	University of Sunderland	£525 per year (First Year), £825 per year (Second Year), £1325 per year (Third Year).	Bursary is awarded if family income is less than £38.000 per year and upon successful completion of each year the bursary grows.
16.	Southampton Solent University	£750 per year each year. (£375 per year for those courses costing less than £3,375)	Bursary is awarded if family income is less than £25,000 per year
17.	Thames Valley University	£315 per year each year.	Bursary is awarded if family income is less than £13.000 per year.
18.	University of Worcester	£500 per year each year.	Unconditional – offered to all students.

* Please note that all the above mentioned bursaries/scholarships are offered in order to help you with your living costs (accommodation, food, personal expenses). They will be awarded after 1st January 2012 so you should have your first months fully covered from home in terms of expenses.
